Public Art Opportunity in the City of Clemson

Proposed Project: Public mural project in downtown Clemson, South Carolina

The Project

The City of Clemson Arts and Culture Commission (Commission) has initiated a public mural project as way of establishing a public art presence in downtown Clemson. The artwork will be located on the side wall of a historic building in downtown Clemson. Clemson community members will be invited and encouraged to participate in the process of selecting the artwork.

Goals

- Establish a public art presence in downtown Clemson
- Create a piece of public art for an outdoor environment that reflects the spirit, history, and uniqueness of the City of Clemson.
- Engage the Clemson residential and business community in the decision-making process
- Promote downtown Clemson as a destination dedicated to fostering community collaborations and partnerships.
- Select a dedicated and qualified artist or artist team that can demonstrate artistic excellence while completing this project on time and within budget.

Completed proposals will be on display at Clemson City Hall from March 23 - 31, 2020. Community members will be invited to share their input.

The Site

The site is the highly visible and prominent side wall of a historic building in downtown Clemson located at 367 College Avenue, Clemson, SC, home to Judge Keller's Store. The wall dimensions are 24'.8" +/- by 21'.2" +/- . Approximately 85% of the wall surface is cement stucco that has been painted with brick underlying the stucco with approximately 15% of the wall surface being exposed painted brick.



Artist Scope of Work

Artists/Artist Teams submitting proposals are responsible for the following:

- Develop a concept for a mural on the project site.
- Submit a proposal that aligns with the established goals of the project
- Submit questions within the established timeline
- Conduct research as necessary to understand the site, the project, Clemson's history and culture, and other considerations as necessary to inform the artistic approach.

Artists/Artist Teams selected for community input are responsible for the following:

- Create a mock-up of the artwork concept suitable for display in Clemson City Hall.
- If selected for final review, presentation of concept to Commission members.

Artist/Artist Team selected for the commission are responsible for the following:

- Create an approved design for the artwork.
- Collaborate with the City staff, Commission members, and building owner on the completion of the artwork.
- Fulfill artist responsibilities within the contracted budget and timeline
- Participate in community engagement and education activities

The City's and/or Commission's responsibilities include:

- Coordinate reviews and permissions with regard to artist selection and concept development with appropriate partners.
- Provide technical assistance as coordinated in advance.
- Coordinate marketing, documentation, and public engagement.

Budget

The maximum budget available for the artwork is \$10,000. This budget will be all-inclusive to include artist fees, artist assistant costs, artist studio costs, scaffolding and ladder equipment, materials and supplies, travel-related expenses, specialty consultants, preparation and installation of the artwork, and other associated costs. External costs such as marketing, documentation, security, and evaluation do not need to be included in the budget.

Artist Selection Process

Eligibility

We are seeking artists or collaborative artist teams who can make a commitment to working in Clemson as necessary to fulfill the responsibilities of this project. For the purposes of this RFP, "artist" refers to an individual artist or a team of artists. Any artist, and/or team, whose primary residence is in South Carolina, established or emerging, working in any medium is encouraged to apply. Please note that we cannot offer additional budgetary resources to individual members. Artists must be citizens of the U.S. or authorized to work in the U.S.

Selection Process

This will be an open call. Artist proposals will be solicited by the Commission. The Commission and its artistic advisors will review the artist submissions and identify the short list of finalists. Up to five artists/teams will be asked to submit their concept for input and voting by the Clemson residential and business community. The Commission will award the final commission, in consultation with the community. The decision will be based on a review of artist/team qualifications and concepts using the criteria that are listed below. The building owner and Commission are not required to make a selection from the submissions received if, in the Commission's and/or building owner's judgment, the relevance, quality, or the qualifications of the artists are not appropriate.

Qualifications and Review Criteria

The evaluation of artist/team qualifications will be based on a review of completed artworks, artworks in progress, or as otherwise described in curatorial writings, critiques, articles, or other publications. The artists' qualifications shall demonstrate:

- Experience in creating permanent, durable, outdoor public art works
- Appreciation of design in a public space.
- Ability to accomplish projects of similar complexity within the budget, timeline, and constraints presented based on examples of prior artwork
- Experience in community-engaged art processes and research
- Ability to create site-specific art work that is responsive to the opportunities and constraints of the site
- Ability to create art work that engages a wide audience

The evaluation of the finalist's artist/team concept will be based on a review of submitted concepts using the goals outlined for the project as well as the following criteria:

- Creativity in addressing the constraints of the site through materials and methods
- Creativity in community engagement approach
- Success in reflecting the community's vision and spirit
- Feasibility of completing the project within the allotted budget and timeframe

Application Requirements

The following are required by March 2, 2020 in digital format (PDF file)-

- Completed application and plan for preparation and maintenance
- Narrative and design illustrating the mural concept. Include supplemental information such as timeline for completion and approximate dimensions of the proposed mural.
- Budget for the project
- Community engagement and education activities plan
- Supporting materials including images and reviews of previously completed art works. Examples should describe the size, materials, cost, and location of other artworks. References for earlier projects are encouraged.

Applications not in compliance with all stated requirements will not be considered for this project.

Policies

Artists will retain the ownership of design ideas submitted with this application until a selection has been made and a contract signed between the artist, the owner of the building, and the City of Clemson. At the time a contract is awarded, the ownership of the design and the artwork produced, in this case the public art mural, will become the property of the building owner.

Short-list proposals will be printed and displayed at Clemson City Hall. An opening reception will be held to which community members will be invited to discuss and give their opinions on the designs which best fit Clemson. The final selection will be made in accordance with the City of Clemson public art plan.

Financial compensation for completion of the mural will be made in accordance with the agreed upon contract between the artist and the City of Clemson. A suitable Artist Maintenance Plan must be submitted. A sample maintenance plan is included on page four.

Artist Plan for Preparation and Maintenance

This is a sample only. Some elements suggested herein may not apply to all proposals. Artists must each submit an original preparation and maintenance plan with their proposal.

Accomplishment of Public Art Mural Project (*italics below indicate details to be completed by the artist*)

Location: 367 College Avenue, Clemson SC 29631
