Does the City do regular water testing?	Procedure
The City is required to test for lead and copper once every three years. We must collect 30 samples from a 40 sample collection area. Results are shared with those whose samples were provided for testing. The City of Clemson has very low lead and copper counts and is on reduced monitoring	in Place
What can be done to address speeding on Issaqueena Trail?	Ongoing
The Clemson Police Department received \$130,890 in grants to help cover personnel costs for additional DUI and traffic enforcement activities. This will allow us to do more DUI and speeding enforcement city wide. Special details will be set up to address areas that experience high levels of non-compliance.	
Are there plans to install a traffic signal at the westbound Hwy 123/Issaqueena Trail intersection? A light would be helpful because it is difficult to turn left onto Issaqueena due to limited sight lines and traffic.	Procedure in Place
The City meets with SCDOT on a quarterly basis to discuss these kinds of issues. This will be placed on our January 2023 meeting agenda.	
How can we get a street light on Pendleton Road at Rock Creek?	Ongoing
This area is in Clemson University's jurisdiction. Staff has reached out to CU to let them know we have received this request and to see if they have any illuminating plans for this area.	
How can we have a street light installed at the entrance to our neighborhood?	Procedure
Decorative lighting would be purchased by the HOA through their utility account. The HOA would pay all electrical charges throughout the year and would send the City an annual reimbursement request for the electrical charges. Another option would be to have a standard overhead street light installed on the nearest existing utility pole.	in Place
Is the leaf truck map working?	In Progress
The city has a brush truck map that shows our progress and when we will be in your area. We do not currently have a leaf truck map but are in the process of creating one in response to this request.	
How can we lower the speed limit in our neighborhood?	Procedure in Place
The City will conduct a speed study if the majority of residents in the area request a reduced speed limit. The results would be reviewed and considered by the City Engineer.	
What is the City's experience with neighborhood watch groups?	Ongoing
We are not aware of any groups that are currently up and running and that is probably due to low crime rates. The Police Department would be happy to work with any neighborhood that was interested in setting up a neighborhood watch.
