Children at Play sign requested for Wren Street <i>The sign has been installed at this location.</i>	Complete
Address Line of sight issues at Oak and Old Greenville Hwy. Difficult to see oncoming traffic from Oak attempting to turn left onto Old Greenville Hwy. <i>Nothing can be within 30 feet of a stop sign. We have asked the General Manager to install bollards to create a "No Parking Zone" and will follow up.</i>	Ongoing
Can yard debris in Country Walk be picked up more than once per month? <i>Each zone in the City is serviced once per month. Additional pick ups in certain areas would cause delays in other parts of the City. In this meeting, the extra pick ups were requested because the resident did not have a way to store the debris in a way that didn't kill their grass. Possible solutions are to reach out to the Home Owners Association to see if debris can be stored along median island curbs across the street on roads that have a median island. Another possibility is a designated debris storage site somewhere in the neighborhood. Sometimes, large/emergency debris piles cannot be avoided so customers can always request special pick ups by calling the Public Works Department at 864-653-2053.</i>	In Progress - Work with Neighborhood

The mask mandate is a tool daycare operators can use to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The City is allowing those closest to the situation to enforce the ordinance in a manner that allows them to be responsive to their situation. We have also delivered a total of 1000 kids masks to daycare centers in the City.</i>	Procedure in Place
The traffic on Cherry Road can back up to 76 at times. <i>The City received a notice of award from the Pickens County Transportation Committee on August 9, 2021 that they approved \$250,000 in funding for a Cherry Road and West Cherry road intersection improvement project. Another \$250,000 is to be allocated to the same project in 2022. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in the summer of 2022.
