Does the City regulate water pressure throughout the day?	Procedure	
The City does not regulate water pressure throughout the day. Our pressure is set by our tank elevations in town and depending on the elevation of your home determines what water pressure you will have. If you are around Lake Hartwell elevation, your water pressure will be higher. If your home is on a higher elevation, your pressure will be lower. We maintain adequate pressure in our system so that we do not go below the SCDHEC required minimum pressure. Your water pressure can vary throughout the day depending upon the height of the water in the tanks and whether the pumps are on or not. This variation usually would be less than 6 - 7 PSI.	in Place	
We receive our water from the Anderson Regional Joint Water System, (ARJWS), and they pump it to us from Anderson. There are water tanks around Pendleton Road that receive the water and they are basically all the same elevation. These tanks help to maintain our pressure and give us water storage.		
We actually have two distinct pressure zones in Clemson which we call the Clemson System (low pressure) and the high pressure Zone which is basically the Old East Clemson Water System which is along Hwy 93. We pump the water up to the high pressure zone to the water tank on West Lane from the low pressure zone. This zone feeds the East Clemson area and can supply water to the Town of Central to their tank on Hwy 93.		
Can the City look into repairing the entrances onto the bridge over HWY 123 at Berkley?	Ongoing	
City Staff has reached out to SCDOT about repairing the potholes and damage.		
Can the City look into installing orange poles on Frontage Rd.?	Ongoing
